

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The Voyage of H.M.S. Beagle II

Last year I embarked, almost unwittingly, on a voyage of discovery into another real world, the world of today unfolding into tomorrow. I looked about and found myself surrounded by life of all description. My fellow human beings were there with me and we could communicate with each other, albeit most often through the frail and mysterious tool of language. But there was music and art and the poetry of our very bodies as well as mere language. We were life, and not only could we communicate with other life, but we could communicate with our selves.

I had met men whom others would call schizophrenic and had found them alive and human. Then I visited Attica. Shining in the bright sunshine of a warm spring day and nestled in the green, rolling hillside outside the peaceful community of Attica, the prison took on the grandeur of a Disneyland castle. Inside the illusion disappeared. Cold, grey stone corridors and poorly lit chambers with the metallic sounds of steel doors and the echoes of footsteps and hostile, hushed voices filled one's mind. I talked with the men inside. I could not tell truly who were the keepers and who the kept: all were imprisoned in a living hell at the will of a society which had rejected and forgotten them. My mind was torn open, never to be the same again.

Discovery: Somehow the old stereotypes have never seemed to fit since then. It is no longer possible to tell the "good guys" from the "bad guys", except by the color of their cowboy hats. We are at once the same human beings we always were. Our culture has changed with the times, but what of our selves?

Discovery: Mankind's future rests in the capacity of culture to unleash man's inner potential for comprehending the universe of life. I strongly sense that we are on the threshold of a new world order which may emerge during our lifetime. I would very much like to taste and breathe in the freshness of a new culture, built on the foundations of the old.

Discovery: Building a new culture will probably much more resemble weaving than stonemasonry. It will begin with a sharing of minds on levels more fundamental than our superficial differences.

Discovery: Such sharing is possible today. The major philosophies of mankind, as we now know them, can be seen as but strands woven into a dazzling tapestry. When seen in their myriad points of contact, they are capable of opening an inner world of harmony known only to a few in our time. As the ranks of this group swell, men will be drawn together to resolve their differences in order that they may live in peace with their neighbors. Men could be as one someday.

Discovery: What seems to hold us back is an almost impenetrable fear of the inner life of the mind, a profound mistrust of that whole sphere of reality which cannot be directly verified objectively. We are compelled into a state of closed-mindedness. Our consciousness has been contracted, and we are blocked from seeing the common humanity of other men. We all "know" that one meets another best through open-mindedness, but we no longer know what "open-mindedness" means.

Discovery: It is all too easy to step unguided into the world of life by just looking about. Where is 1945? Can you find it in reality? It is there somewhere. Indeed, where are yesterday and tomorrow? These worlds are so real and yet so apparently unknown that they bring some to nightmares and insomnia, others to fantasy and nostalgia.

Little wonder is it that increasing numbers in our society have turned to drugs, some in frantic attempts to close the doors of their minds further, others risking insanity to tear these doors off at their hinges.

Discovery: Fortunately, there is much more sense which can be made of this entire realm. It need not be uncharted or terrifying territory. It is the realm of the great philosophies and religions of humanity. Together, their fabric forms a contour map of society in the process of becoming.

One is reminded of a magic carpet ride over a land of many paths to choose and many miles to travel. A way can be found which anticipates and avoids many obstacles:

"Look at the course which is being trodden and examine the omens it displays. If it be completed without failure there will be great good fortune.

"Interpretation: Treading carefully as he moves forward, examining the ground for useful portents all the way, will lead him to a fortunate outcome."

Discovery: To discover the philosophical tapestry of the world is to be transformed. The awareness asks for and receives a change of mind so profound that it cannot be reversed. But one can come to this realization only through the process of discovery - memorization alone is inadequate.

Discovery: Such is the mind of men we are able to share, entering others and allowing them to enter us through communication. How hollow can seem the material world by comparison.

H.M.S. Beagle II entered the realm of life through the Attica looking-glass. We have found ourselves in the dead of night, at sea in the deep, mysterious waters of man's "unconscious" mind, and are learning to chart our course by the stars of wise men from ages past. It turns out that these are the same treacherous, stagnant waters where giant hydrae form in times of darkness.

It is our theory, however, that there are potentially two major varieties of hydra in the sea of humanity, one of which thrives in darkness and the other in light. We have identified the dreaded mythical variety and are now watching and waiting for its replacement by a more gentle, evolutionary form of human interaction, a merger of independently enlightened minds, a coalescence, a truly human hydra. The times are right.

In many ways it can appear to be a superficial and crazy world in which we live, filled often with seemingly senseless entrapments. The universe is not senseless, however, and these days, too, will pass. Even anguish is more real, true, and free than bewilderment.

The following Volume is the first log of our voyage. In more contemporary terms it might be referred to as a gemstone file, but more accurately it may be seen as a view through the past and into the world beyond.

The spirit of man is in darkness. Our craft may seem frail when compared with the Ship of State, but it is seaworthy and we are booking passage in search of light. Anyone who wishes may begin Volume II with me.

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


If we cannot learn to live lives of joy together as brothers then we will surely perish, a glossamer experiment of nature which illuminated the void of time but for a moment.







In the interest of fairness, the flying wedge was declared illegal on all playing fields and has not been used since.


Creeping pharoah






Fig. 76. Aquarium specimen of Pelmatohydra with tentacles well extended. ×6.
