Politics in 2019

On March 9 at the SXSW festival in Austin, Texas, Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez spoke about the future of the country and her election to the U.S. House of Representatives.

"Part of what happened last year was a crack in the system," she explained.

How often have you seen a Puerto Rican woman from the Bronx, who isn't even 30-years-old, break down the wall and win big in politics? Not often, at all.

But there was one question that stood out amongst the political talk and it was aimed at her fellow women of color. Two young women from the Radical Monarchs of Austin asked Ocasio-Cortez what advice she had for breaking into politics. And her reply was succinct and apropos.

"Stop trying to navigate systems of power and start building your own power," she said.

"There are so many subconscious forces that make us try to act like somebody else ... but when you're a woman of color, there are so many things about you that is non-conforming," she said.

On moderation: "Moderate is not a stance. It's just an attitude towards life of, like, 'meh'. We've become so cynical, that we view 'meh,' or 'eh'—we view cynicism as an intellectually superior attitude, and we view ambition as youthful naiveté when we think about the greatest things we have ever accomplished as a society have been ambitious acts of visions. And the 'meh' is like worshipped now for what? Like, for what?"

"We've strayed so far away from what has really made us powerful, and just, and good, and equitable, and productive, and so I think all of these things sound radical compared to where we are, but where we are is not a good thing," she said. "And this idea of, like, 10 percent better from... garbage, is, shouldn't be what we settle for, it's like this, like, it feels like, moderate is not a stance, it's just an attitude toward life of, like, 'hmmm.'"

On the working class: "A perfect example of how special interests and the powerful have pitted white working-class Americans against brown and black working-class Americans, in order to just screw over all working-class Americans, is Reaganism in the '80s, when he started talking about welfare queens."
